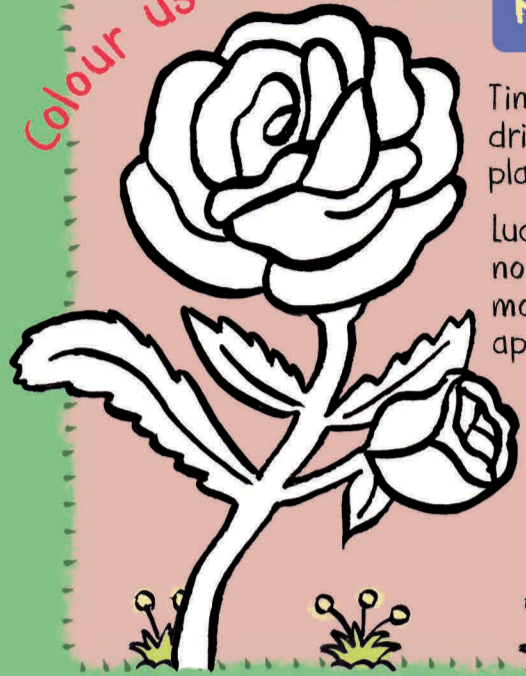

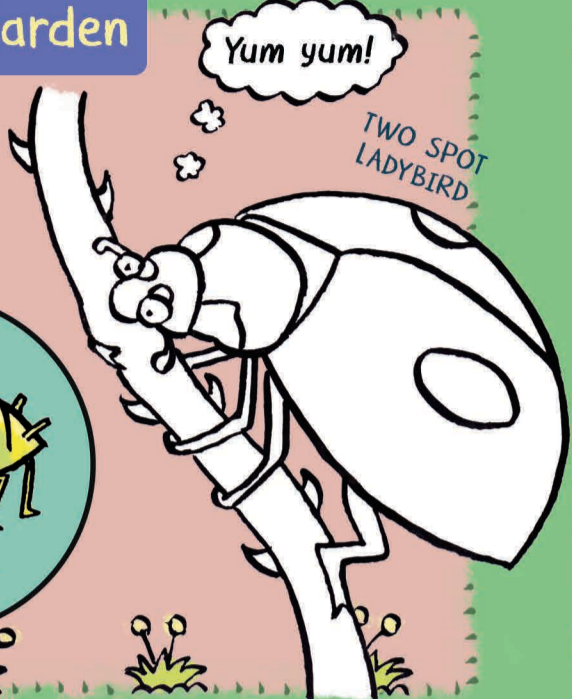
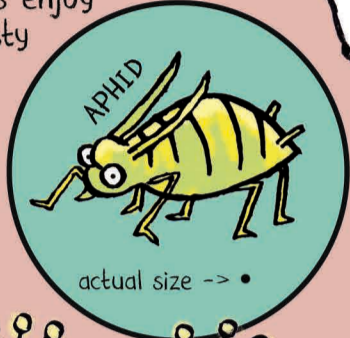


Colour us in!

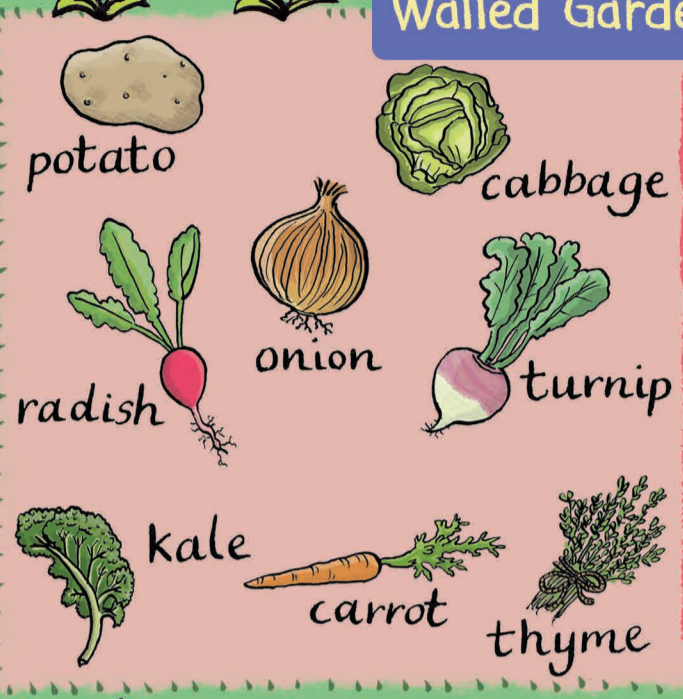
Roam in the Rose Garden

Walled Garden Word Search

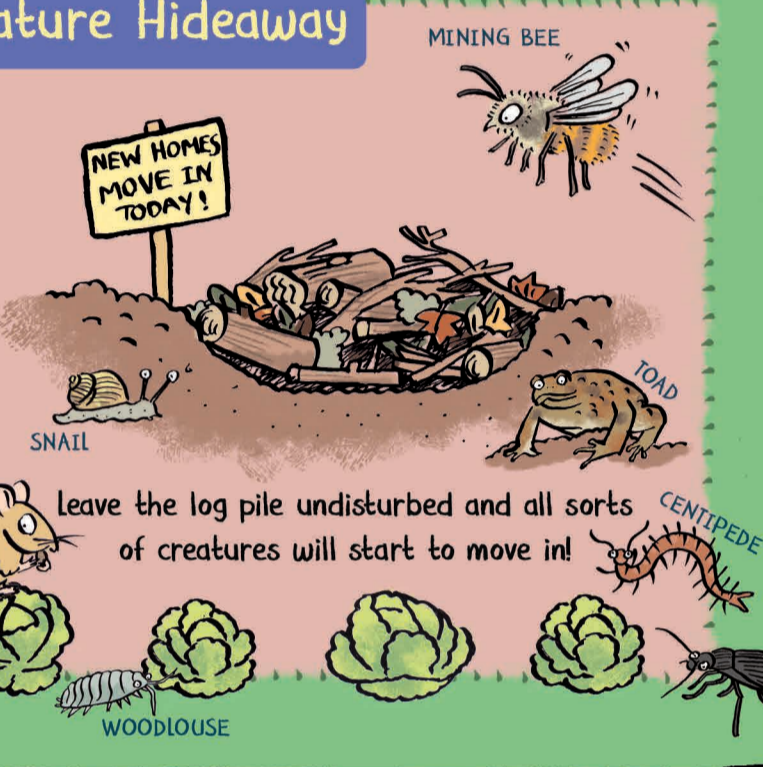

Secret Creature Hideaway

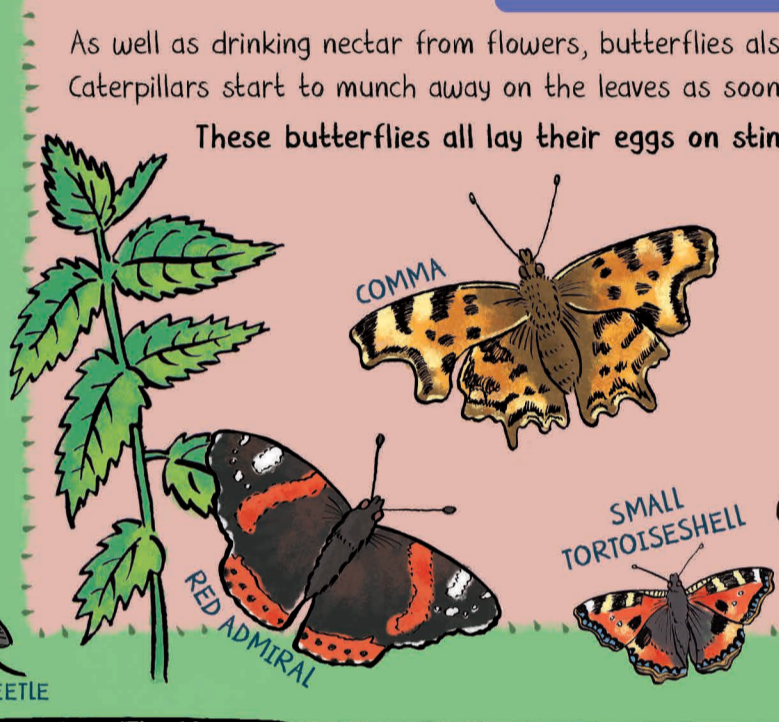
1. Find a shady spot in your garden and ask an adult to help you dig a shallow hole to build your shelter in.
2. Gather up logs, leaves, moss and twigs from your garden and stack the logs in the hole.
3. Once you have 2 or 3 layers of logs, pile on the twigs, leaves and moss to fill in the spaces.



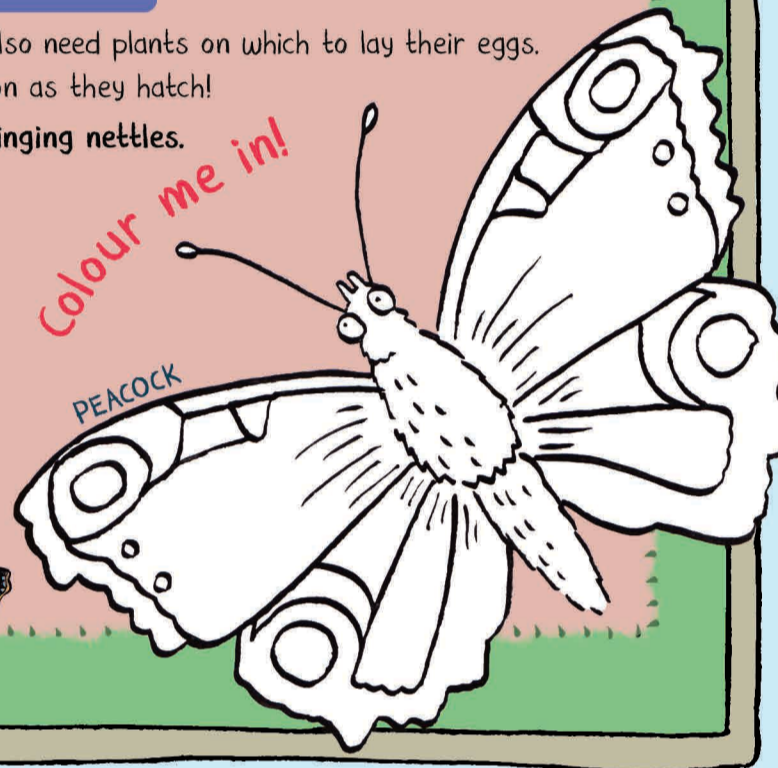
Leave the log pile undisturbed and all sorts of creatures will start to move in!

Fox cub



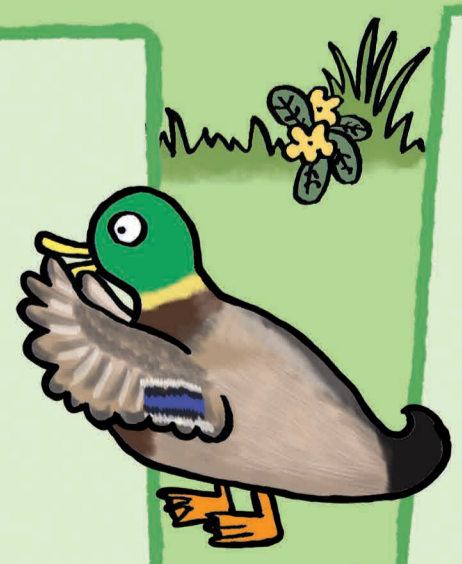
Talk to the foxes; make your best howls, growls and yelps.

Stay as quiet and still as you can and see if your family can spot you.

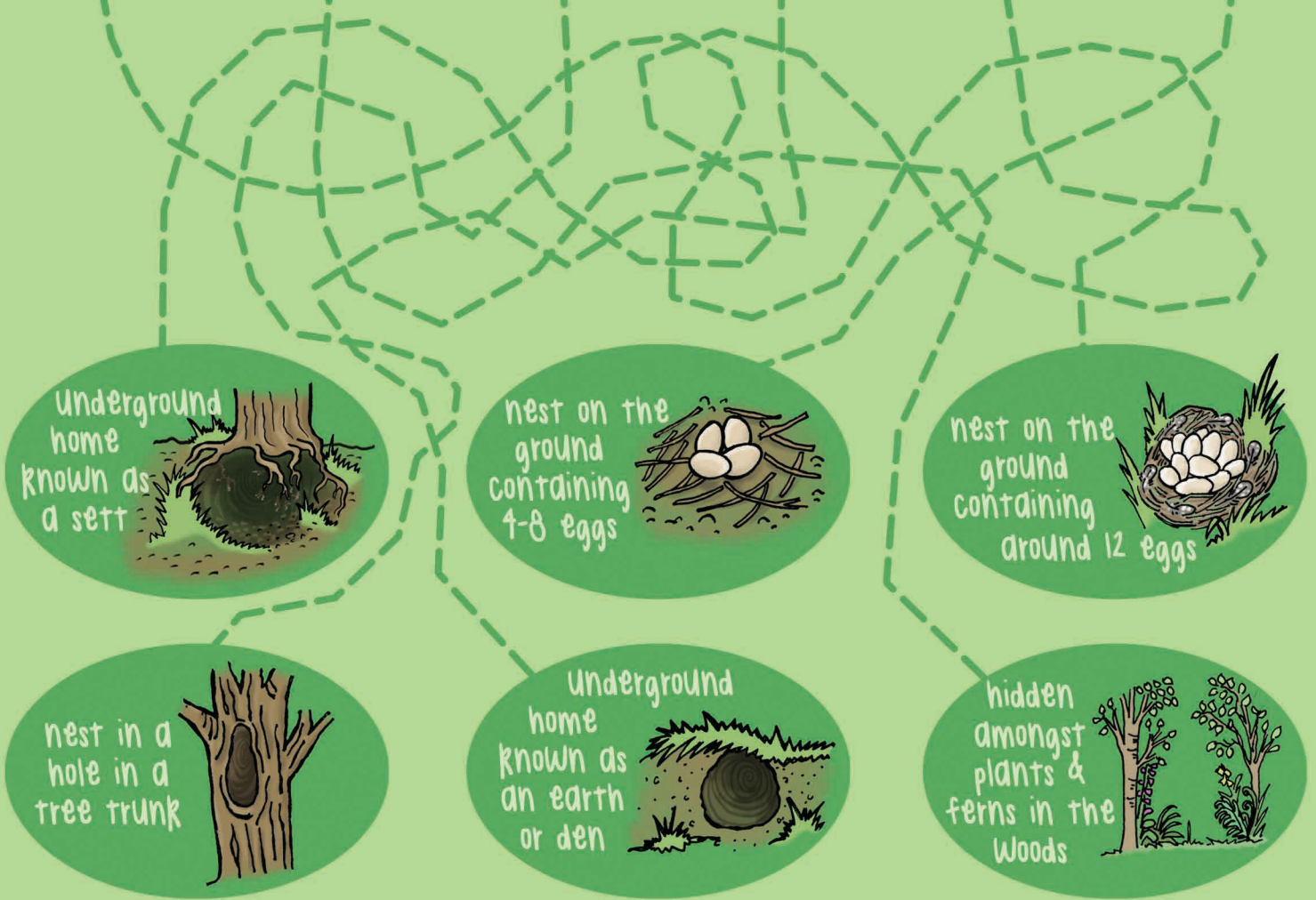
Owlets
